Crovisier and Rams recently constructed an embedded Cantor set in \mathbf{R} and showed that it could not be realized as an attractor of any iterated function system (IFS) using measure-theoretic properties. An example of a locally connected continuum in \mathbf{R}^2 which is not the attractor of any IFS on \mathbf{R}^2 is constructed in a work of Kwieciński. Kwieciński points out that a variation on his main construction provides an arc in \mathbf{R}^2 which is not the attractor of any IFS either. Here, for each $n \geq 1$, construction of an n -cell in \mathbf{R}^{n+1} with the feature that this n -cell is not the attractor of any IFS on \mathbf{R}^{n+1} will be described.
