Englishman Thomas Harriot (c. 1560-1621) may be best known today for having spent the winter of 1585-86 working to establish the Virginia Colony in America. However, in his own time he was known as an innovative mathematician and scientist, albeit one who never quite seemed to get around to publishing his work. The publication of Harriot's manuscript work on mathematics and science has been a dream of his friends and followers for over 400 years. Modern digitization and the efforts of Matthias Schemmel and Jacqueline Stedall have finally made that dream a reality. We review Harriot's publication history, assess the current state of Harriot scholarship, and suggest directions for the future. (Received September 22, 2015)
