Complex spatial-temporal patterns can be difficult to characterize quantitatively, especially similar patterns formed under different conditions. Persistent homology provides a meaningful low-dimensional quantitative summary of topological structure of dynamic data. These summaries retain a remarkable amount of information that allows for the investigation of the influence of nonlinear parameters, classification of data by parameters, and study of defect evolution.
