We treat two Dirichlet problems for the p -Laplacian with a spectral parameter near the first eigenvalue λ_1 :

$$-\Delta_p u = \lambda |u|^{p-2}u + f(x) \text{ in } \Omega; \quad u = 0 \text{ on } \partial\Omega, \quad (1)$$

and

$$\begin{aligned} \frac{\partial u}{\partial t} - \Delta_p u &= \lambda |u|^{p-2}u + f(x, t), \quad (x, t) \in \Omega \times (0, T_\infty); \\ u(x, t) &= 0, \quad (x, t) \in \partial\Omega \times (0, T_\infty); \\ u(x, 0) &= u_0(x), \quad x \in \Omega. \end{aligned} \quad (2)$$

Here, $1 < p < \infty$ and $\lambda \in \mathbf{R}$ is near λ_1 . The interval of existence in time, $(0, T_\infty)$, is assumed to be maximal. We show that, if $0 \leq f \not\equiv 0$ is in $L^\infty(\Omega)$ and $\lambda_1 < \lambda < \lambda_1 + \delta$, where $\delta > 0$ is small enough, then every solution of problem (1) is negative. If $f > 0$ and $u_0 \in C^1(\overline{\Omega})$ is arbitrary, possibly nonpositive, and $\lambda_1 < \lambda < \lambda_1 + \delta$, then there is some time $T \in (0, T_\infty)$ such that every solution of problem (2) satisfies $u(x, t) > 0$ for all $x \in \Omega$ and all $t \in (T, T_\infty)$.
